### Emergency Services Assistance:

#### Medical Services:

- 391 prescriptions
- 36 pairs of eyeglasses
- 12 medical appliances
- 60 dental treatments

#### Eviction Prevention/Utilities:

- Eviction was prevented for 119 households
- 175 utility disconnections

#### Miscellaneous Programs:

- 800 pairs of school shoes
- 252 box fans
- Other services include providing: DATA bus passes, smoke detector batteries, and free notary services



### Food Pantry:

- 276,223 meals (including meals distributed at the Holiday Clearing House)
- 56,267 pounds of fresh produce through the produce markets
- 847 Commodity Supplement Food Program boxes
- Deliver weekend food backpacks for 200 families



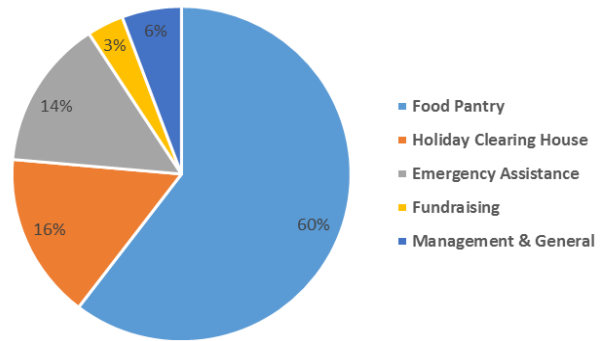
### Holiday Clearing House:

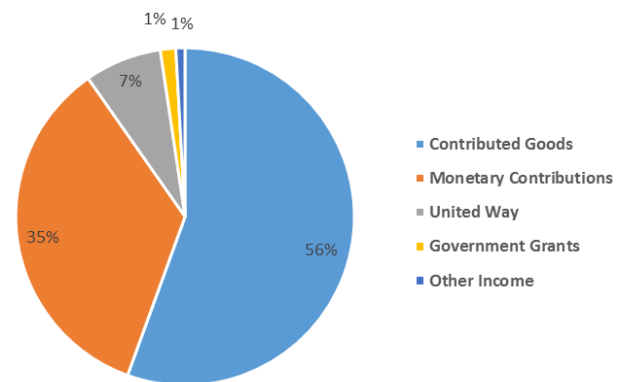
